ased on a pre scheduled plan, A delegation from the Accreditation Council of Pharmacy Education in the United States of America (ACPE) had visited the College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences (COPHS) at the University of Science and Technology of Fujairah (USTF), as part of the field visit phase to follow up the compatibility of the work progress of the college with the international standards followed by the Council to ensure the quality of the educational system for educational institutions certified by it.

At the beginning of the visit, the delegation of the Council met His Excellency Prof. Ali Abu ElNour –

Chancellor of University of Science and Technology of Fujairah - and Prof. Dr. Sumia Sir El Khatim - Acting Dean of the College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences. After that, the delegation started reviewing the academic plan of the college and the progress of the educational process, as well as the laboratory equipment in the college and the extent of its conformity with the standard specifications required by the Council.

UNESCO chair for women in Science and Technology had honored Prof. Sumia Sir El khatim Mohamed, Dean College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences at University of Science and Technology of Fujairah, during the chair celebrations of the International Women's Day which took place on Tuesday February 11, 2020.

Prof. Sumia was nominated earlier by Her Excellence Prof. Fadwa Abdulrahman Ali Taha, Vice Chancellor of the University of Khartoum, along with 9 other female full professors from the University of Khartoum, to be honored for their unlimited giving to serve the science and the community. The celebration was held in collaboration with the UNESCO office in Khartoum, World Association of Sustainable Development, Sudanese National Committee for Education, Science and culture, Knowledge Transfer Program, Secretariat of Sudanese Working Abroad. 



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Professor at Stanford University, USA solicited the College of Business Administration-USTF to Share Research Expertise

Professor Lisa Blaydes has solicited the research expertise of Dr. Abdallah Elamin - Associate Professor of Management at the College of Business Administration - University of Science and Technology in Fujairah. Prof Lisa asked to borrow the sole standard scale (Arabic Version) that developed by Dr. Elamin to measure the attitudes toward women who work in the Arab Muslim context.

Dr. Lisa is a Professor of Political Science, Public Administration, and Gender Studies at Stanford University – the second top university in the world ranked after the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT). Professor Lisa research interests are in the fields of international, political and gender studies in the world and the Middle East.

Professor Lisa relied on Dr. Elamin's research in the areas of attitudes and behavior towards women who work and gender in management, where Dr. Elamin developed a multidimensional scale (Arabic Version) to measure attitudes and behavior toward women who work in the Arab Muslim societies in the light of the original developed scale (MAWWWS). Dr. Elamin has tested and validated the newly developed version of the scale to confirm its validity and reliability in the Arab-Islamic context.

His research work using this scale has been published in the "Personnel Review Journal", and has significantly contributed to enriching the scientific knowledge about women who work in the Arab-Islamic region in the academic circles.

SMARTPHONE photography Workshop

The College of Architecture, Art, and Design – Interior Design Department has organized an online two session workshop under the title of "Smartphone Photography" which was presented by Prof. Ahmed Belal, Professor in the Scientific College of Design. The workshop aimed to provide the participants with a creative experience on how to use

their smartphones to snap creative and well taken photographs, how to edit them and present them. The first session was conducted on Monday, 28th of September, where the participants received an informational lecture as an introduction to Photography, editing on "Snapseed" and using "Canva" as a tool to present and write on pictures.

The second session was performed a week later Monday, 5th of October. The participants were asked to use the data they received as a guide to implement and snap 3 photographs using their smartphone, edit them and present them in session 2 to discuss their outcome. Both sessions took place online through distance and 15 participants attended session 1 while 8 participants attended and presented their work in session 2. The attendees included USTF affiliates and external universities students.




A dialogue session entitled the effects of the Corona pandemic on civil dealings

n the context of realizing the vision and mission of the University of Science and Technology in Fujairah and its goals in constructive and fruitful interaction with local community institutions. The College of Law, in cooperation with the Emirates Association of Lawyers and Jurists, organized a seminar entitled: The Effects of the Corona Pandemic on Legal Transactions

As the symposium dealt with the legal debate raised about the pandemic and the availability of the concept and conditions of force majeure. Consequently, it is invoked to pay legal liability for non-implementation of contractual obligations in various







contracts, especially time contracts such as rent, labor, and contracts whose implementation is lax, such as contracting: construction, building and supply contracts.

The symposium dealt with the effects of the pandemic on the implementation of the provisions of the Personal Status Law in terms of regulating visibility and custody provisions and dealing with family disputes. The symposium ended with a discussion of the effects of the pandemic on labor relations and the legislative and governmental solutions taken to mitigate the effects of the pandemic on this vital sector. Dr. Issa Rabadi, Dean of the College, Prof. Dr. Khalaf Al-Muhammad, and Dr. Muhammad Hassan participated in the symposium.
